- 9. Under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- 10. Theft
- 11. Inappropriately touching other people
- 12. Refusing to follow specific directions
- 13. Disruptive in the classroom
- 14. Not in the appropriate place in the classroom or assigned area
- 15. Swearing or vulgar language
- 16. Bothering or interfering with others
- 17. Name calling
- 18. Getting involved in another's problem
- 19. Very upset: need to "cool off"
- 20. Smoking in the building or on grounds
- 21. Not ready to return from time-out: failure to comply with reentry instructions
