Make praise pay off in motivating students. Give messages that let them know you appreciate them and want them to be motivated to learn.

Effective Praise	Don't Say	Do Say
Identifies a specific accomplishment	Good work.	You used great describing words in your story!
Gives a specific student attention	Great work everyone	You did your math problems very accurately.
Helps him/her understand the value his/her accomplishment	Everyone participated today	The questions you asked really helped the group.
Helps students appreciate their progress	You got the answer right	You're working hard to solve the problem and understand the correct steps.
Recognizes old and new accomplishments	You're doing almost as well as	You conquered and adding & subtracting and now multiplication.
Credits effort and ability	You were lucky today.	You are working hard to improve your spelling. Today you spelled more words right.
Focuses attention on their own successful behavior	I'm really helping you.	You should be proud of the way you are paying attention and following directions.
Helps students understand that they focused on their task	I chose the right project for you, didn't I?	Your science project shows you really enjoyed learning about the assignment.
