Beliefs About Children's Development

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- 1. Deviant vs. Typical Behavior: deviant, unacceptable behavior is always interwoven with typical, acceptable behavior.
- 2. Sequential Development: normal processes of social, emotional, and behavioral development follows an orderly and predictable sequence, yet it also is

uniquely individual because of biological predispositions and foundations laid in prior experiences with people.

3. Pleasure and Success: productive changes occur when behavior brings successful and satisfying results.



4. Relevant Experiences: a student learns and grows by cultural and personally meaningful experiences.
