		5. Were all my supplies and equipment ready to use?
		6. Was the first information given to the class important to the topic of the day?
		7. Did I state the daily expectation and the lesson objective clearly?
		8. Was I distracted by interruptions (students or other) that also led students to
		focus on the distraction rather than my information?
		9. Was the material relevant, age and academically appropriate, and well-paced?
		10. Was the lesson concept made concrete by giving definitions, examples and applications?
		11. Did my students know what the grade would be based on?
		12. Was the supplemental material (films, tapes, etc.) an addition to the lesson
		rather than a distraction?
		13. Was the supplemental material easy for students to follow and make notes?
		14. Did I stay on the topic and was I able to cover the content?
		15. Did my delivery express enthusiasm?
		16. Did I express that I felt the topic was important?
		17. Did I check with students to determine their level of comprehension
		(e.g. check note taking, questioning, quizzes, etc.)?
