- ☐ Two conflicting parties meet in confidential sessions
- ☐ Trained peer guides discussion of their differences to find solutions to their problem.
- ☐ Disputants sign a contract that outlines what each will do to solve the problem.

Mediation differs from trial in many ways:

- Trial assumes guilt and innocence.
- Mediation assumes no fault.
- A trial seeks to learn the truth.
- Mediation seeks to find an equitable solution.
- A trial deals with facts.
- Mediation deals with the feelings and perceptions behind the facts.
- In a trial, the judge makes a decision.
- In mediation, the disputants make the decisions.
